INIT makes Christmas donation to Transport Benevolent Fund

Public transport workers and their families who are facing hardship will benefit from a £3,000 donation to The Transport Benevolent Fund CIO (TBF) by INIT Innovations in Transportation in Nottingham.

Every Christmas worldwide, subsidiaries of INIT's parent company, INIT AG Karlsruhe/Germany, each select a charity within their area of operation, with TBF this year's chosen recipient.
